


WHAT IS ONLINE GENDER-BASED **VIOLENCE?**

Online gender-based violence encompasses acts of gender-based violence that are committed, abetted or aggravated, in part or fully, by the use of information and communication technologies (ICTs), such as phones, the internet, social media platforms, and email.



HOW PREVALENT **IS ONLINE** GENDER-BASED **VIOLENCE IN** THE **PHILIPPINES?**



The key findings are from 236 cases reported on Take Back the Tech! Philippines online map from 2012 to last guarter of 2017 (ph.tbtt.apc.org/mapit)

Almost 81% of women, aged 30 years old below are more likely to experience online violence

Video/webcam (45%), Facebook (45%) & Mobile Phone (34%) are the platforms where MOST

Majority of reported cases or (54%) are perpetrated by SOMEONE KNOWN to the victim-survivor.

Places with the most number of reported cases are from Metro Manila, Cebu, Davao, Cagayan de Oro,

THE MOST COMMON **VIOLATIONS ARE...**



Monitoring and Tracking (61%)

Sharing and/or disseminating private information and information (55%)



Threats of violence & blackmail (28%) &

Taking Photo/Video without consent (23%)



Repeated Harassment (37%)

Stealing Identity (28%)

Abusive Comments (26%)

Deleting, changing or faking personal data, photos/videos (12%)





