No makeup, accessories during Step 2 process: PhilSys

The Philippine Identification System Act prohibits registrants from wearing makeup and body accessories during biometric data collection. Holders of PhilID cards are likewise reminded not to post their PhilID, PhilSys Card Number, and PhilSys Number on social media. [READ MORE →](#)
